



DRESS STANDARDS

Green Acres Dress Code has been designed to reflect the standard of the Club yet be practical for all Club members.

The Club's Management, Director of Golf and Golf Staff are authorised by the Board to ensure that members, visitors and spectators comply with the dress code. The judgement of the staff as to the suitability of attire shall be considered final. Persons not complying with the dress code may be required to leave the Clubhouse or the course.

ON THE COURSE AND PRACTICE AREA

- Golfing attire is to be clean, tidy and appropriate to the game.
- Only soft spikes are permitted.
- Shirts must be collared or have a golf style mock neck design.
- Garments designed to be worn with a belt must be worn with a belt.
- Socks of any length may be worn, but short socks must be predominantly white.
- No advertising on any clothing including hats, caps and visors is permitted with the exception of discreet golf related or 'designer' emblems or logos.

Unacceptable Course and Practice Area Attire: Men

Shirts not tucked in, t-shirts, denim of any description, caps worn backwards, tracksuits, draw string or elastic waisted trousers or shorts, leisure/cargo or lycra fabric gym style clothing, ¾ length pants, sand shoes, sneakers, runners, thongs and sandals. Trousers must not be tucked in to socks with the exception of plus 2's or plus 4's.

Unacceptable Course and Practice Area Attire: Women

T-shirts, denim of any description, tracksuits, draw string trousers or shorts, leisure/cargo or lycra fabric gym style clothing, sand shoes, sneakers, runners and thongs.

IN THE CLUBHOUSE AND SURROUNDS

Neat casual dress is the minimum standard acceptable within the confines of the Clubhouse. Attire that is acceptable on the course is acceptable in the Clubhouse. Denim jeans may only be worn in the Clubhouse, but they must be clean and tidy and not of the frayed or torn variety. As with the course standard, track pants, 'casual' shorts, tee shirts are not acceptable.

Men must wear shoes. Thongs and sandals are not acceptable. Golf shoes with soft spikes are acceptable.

Caps, visors or hats must be removed inside the Clubhouse.

This dress code applies to members, members' guests, spectators, caddies and corporate golf day players. It does not apply to children 12 years and under.

Please note that members are responsible for their guests attire and must inform them in advance of our requirements to avoid any embarrassment on the day.
